Never Again Rally - 12:30 PM, Sanctuary Steps

We are delighted to have the wonderful music group Emma's **Revolution** join us this week in special witness today. Many thanks to all who have participated over the past 7 months in our ongoing Sunday and Wednesday acts of witness on the steps of our sanctuary. Together we memorialize those children who have died in immigration detention and protest the injustices and atrocities being committed in our names by ICE and the US Customs and Border Patrol.

We invite you to lift your voices in song and word with us, and bear witness with signs, banners, and informational fliers. Together we will act as people of faith and conscience to draw attention to the urgency of ending child detention, reuniting refugee and asylum seeking families, closing the ICE detention camps, and ending the criminalization of seeking asylum and refuge.
