



Come see the artworks of Henry David Sultan and Jenny Badger Sultan! For 53 years, I had the honor of living with and sharing a studio with Jenny Badger Sultan, writes artist Henry David Sultan. When I first met Jenny, she was painting with oil using the wet into wet-into-wet technique that was popular in the College Art Departments and Art Schools during the nineteen sixties. She visited the studios of my friends and me and saw we were painting our images and symbols in a clearly defined way, so-called "Visionary Art." She saw that this was a path she could take which would allow her to express her dreams and imagination. Her oil paintings always had texture, and for a while, she gave that up. However, in a short time she discovered the techniques of the Surrealist's, especially the painter Max Ernst. She began to experiment with these techniques.
