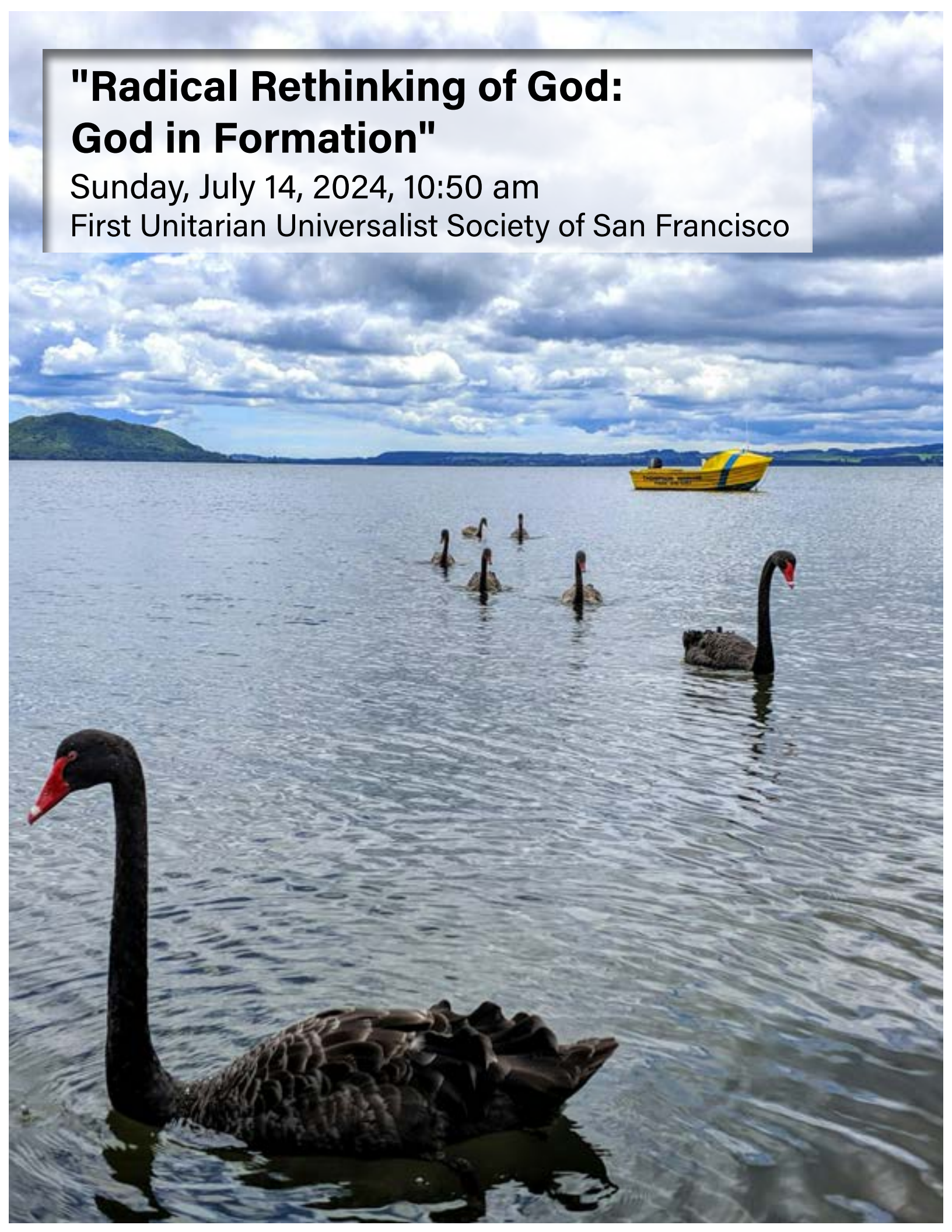

Tommy Kesecker, a virtuosic vibraphonist and marimbist from San Francisco, has been a sought-after teacher and performer for years. He is often compared to a blend of Milt Jackson, a Jamaican steel drummer, and a Balinese gamelan player. Kesecker's passion and skill are evident in his performances, whether with the Klobas/Kesecker Ensemble or at private or corporate events. His debut CD, "No Gravity," features original pieces and fresh interpretations of jazz classics, with tabla master Zakir Hussain adding Indian flavors. The ensemble has a new release, "Moment's Notice," featuring Kesecker on vibraphone and marimba, Klobas on double bass and electric bass, David Rokeach on drums, and Terrence Brewer on electric guitar. Workers Voices/Workers Power on July 20 in the TSK Room from 6-9pm and 21 in the Chapel from 1-8pm

Workers Voices/Workers Power is a series of events scheduled for July 20th and 21st. **The July 20 from 6-9 p.m. event**, "For the Union Makes Us Strong!" will feature a night of working-class music, featuring performances by Bay Area choral groups such as The Freedom Song Network, Vukani Mawethu, La Peña Community Chorus, and Pat Wynne and the Rockin' Solidarity Labor Heritage Chorus. **The July 21 from 1-4pm event**, "Labor Notes Conference/Area Organizing Campaigns Report Back and Discussion," will report back on the Labor Notes Conference in Chicago, which welcomed nearly 5,000 attendees but turned away thousands more. **The July 21 from 5-8 p.m. event** will also feature a discussion on labor storytelling with speakers such as working-class novelist Michael Dunn, picket-line chant leader Bill Shields, area spoken word artists, and the domestic workers theater troupe, La Colectiva de Mujeres Original. This event aims to celebrate and lift up the voices of working people, highlighting their multicultural glory. We are requesting donations to cover the costs of space rental and production.

Protect Our Immigrant Neighbors: Preserve SF's Sanctuary City Policy - July 28, 12:30 pm, TSK Room/Zoom

San Francisco residents have long fought to make the city a sanctuary for undocumented immigrants, with protective ordinances dating back to the 1980s. However, the current administration has debated on weakening these protections, and there has been an increase in federal arrests of immigrants on federal properties within the city. Immigration attorneys **EJ Esperanza** and **Lisa Knox** will discuss defending the sanctuary city status and avoiding reliance on local politicians.
