

Rev. Kevin Alan Mann (he/him/siyá) was ordained by the First Unitarian Church of Oakland in October 2023 and serves as a Chaplain with Sequoia Hospice. He did his Chaplaincy Residency at California Pacific Medical Center and is a member of the Diversity Advisory Council of the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization. As a Queer Filipino American Unitarian Universalist, Kevin's ministry is rooted in building collective solidarity towards anti-racist multicultural Beloved Community.

Rev. Kevin received his Master of Divinity and Social Change from Starr King School for the Ministry in 2016 and serves as the Assistant Professor of Multicultural Chaplaincy and Community Ministries. Kevin is one of the founders of Bay Area DRUUMM (Diverse Revolutionary UU Multicultural Ministries) the regional BIPOC UU network and serves as a Consultant for Partnership with UU Church of the Philippines.


Christine Abraham has appeared as a featured soloist with the orchestras of Philadelphia, San Francisco, Dallas, and St. Louis, as well as the Boston Baroque, Chicago's Music of the Baroque, and the Toronto Consort. 

#### **GLOBAL CONVERSATIONS**

Persistent, Brave Resistance by Iran's Women Prisoners

August 25, 12:30pm in TSK Room/Zoom

This webinar is organized by UUSF Global Conversations and the International Emergency Campaign to Free Iran's Political Prisoners Now (IEC).

More about this event: Last fall, 9 political prisoners wrote a letter from Evin Prison in Tehran warning, "If this war [on Gaza] widens, it could give [the regime] a pretext to use even more violence to suppress protesters, political prisoners, workers' movements, women, students, religious minorities such as the Bahá'í community, and even to extend their attacks against the "Woman, Life, Freedom" movement." This, in fact, is what is rapidly unfolding. Speakers (TBA) from diverse viewpoints will speak on how we can be part of bringing forward another way in the interest of humanity against the false choice of siding with one or the other reactionary regimes, whether the US/Israel or Iran. They will explore why and how it is more urgent than ever for a global grassroots movement to stand with Iran's courageous political prisoners, especially the actions of the heroic women in Evin Prison, who have continued to risk life and limb to repeatedly hold hunger strikes and sit-ins to protest executions, especially those targeting women activists and ethnic minorities.


#### Minister's Book Group: Wednesday, August 28, 6:30 to 8pm, Zoom
