Refuse Fascism: The Trump Regime Must Go - Sunday Forum, September 21 at 9:30 am in the TSK Room and on Zoom

On September 21, Refuse Fascism will be here to discuss the need to remove the Trump regime, starting with protests on November 4, 2025. They argue that fascism is already present and call for millions to rise against it. The movement plans to flood Washington, D.C. with nonviolent protests, surrounding key government buildings. A coalition of faith, community, and civic groups is encouraged to join this effort, drawing inspiration from historical social movements. 
